

As an experienced proofreader for Story Tec, she has a keen eye for detail. She is also a freelance editor for script writers who now have work in development with Black Dog, Red, and Sky comedy.

Outcome: Perfect your pitch, get to grips with your plot, and make sure you have a sound structure.




November: Point of view

How is your novel told? Have you thought about trying out different perspectives, different viewpoints? We'll explore all the different kinds of point of view, from omniscient to first person, and see how each one can inform our own work.

December: Setting

It's time to start writing your novel. This month, we'll look at how you can maximise the potential of your setting - whether it's a colony on Mars or a suburban living room.

Outcome: Through understanding the importance of setting, you'll create a world that the reader believes, giving your text weight, authority, and atmosphere.

January: Character

Alongside time to write, we'll learn the techniques and tools we can use to strengthen and develop our characters, and how you can ensure that their development links closely to the plot.


